HOUSING INFORMATION

Housing and Residence Life

Regularly enrolled single students paying registration fees for a minimum of nine semester hours may apply for on-campus University-owned residence, consisting of residence halls and apartment-style units. Upper-level single students are given priority for assignment to the university's on-campus apartment-style residential facilities on a space-available basis. There is no on-campus married students or family housing. Off Campus Student Services (OCSS) assists graduate students in their search for off-campus housing accommodations. Parking

Everyone who parks on the UCF main campus must display a valid parking permit. Student parking is available on a first-come, first-served basis, and a parking space is not guaranteed. Daily permit holders may not park overnight. Students and staff may park in unreserved faculty spaces after 5:30 p.m. on weekdays, unless otherwise posted. The 24-hour reserved spots are reserved at all times. Service spaces are not open to student parking at any time.

Weekends (from 7:00 a.m. Saturday to 7:00 a.m. on Monday morning) students and staff may park in unreserved spaces within faculty lots. Parking Services also offers assistance to motorists, such as battery jump-starts and unlocking car doors. For more information please visit www.parking.ucf.edu.

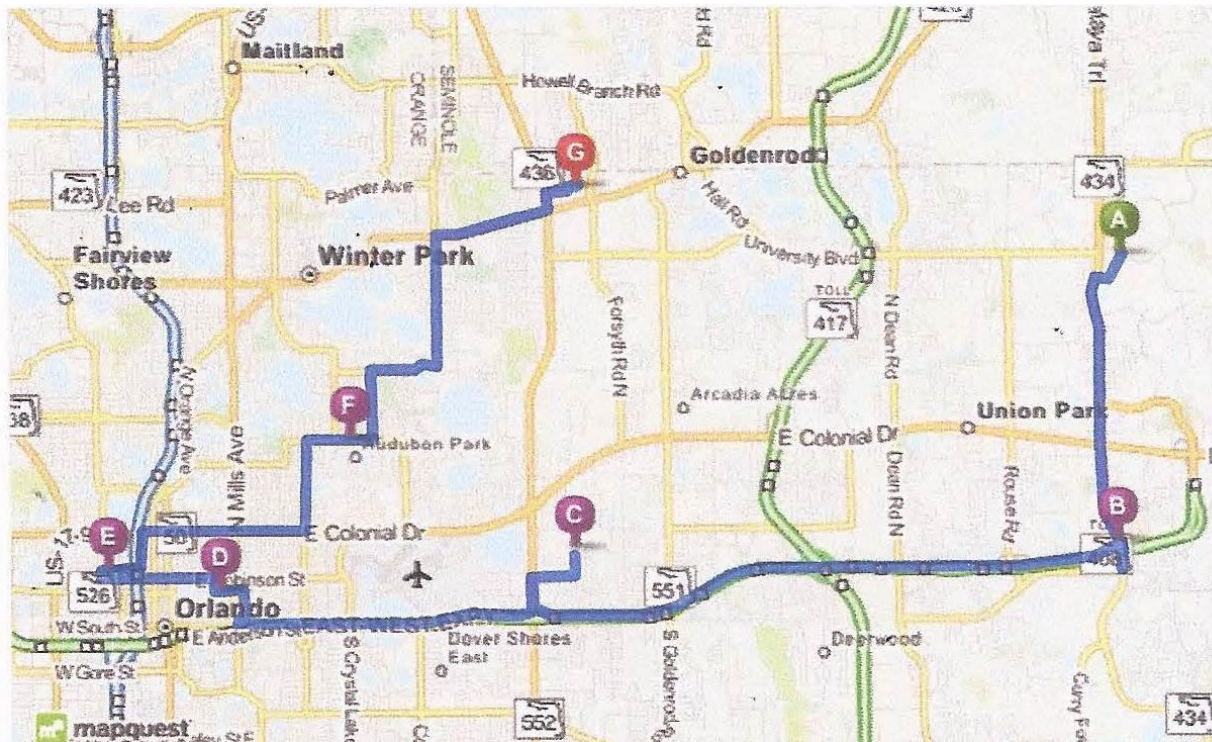
Transit Services
